TRACK DESCRIPTIONS

IMPORTANT: Courses for beginners and advanced Solea users are offered within each track. Please refer to the recommended “Audience” listed in the course description to understand what level of Solea expertise is recommended to get the most out of each course.

RESTORATIVE

Course Description: As more practitioners become involved in the placement of dental implants, the proportion of implant complications will dramatically increase. A recent paradigm shift in dentistry has been the incorporation of regeneration/repair of ailing dental implants. Also, as “saving implants vs. saving teeth” are compared clinically and financially, literature shows a much higher degree of predictability and a lower financial burden when practitioners attempt to keep the existing dentition in the mouth through regenerative dental therapy. This lecture will focus on current and new biotechnology that can enhance regeneration around both teeth and dental implants. This course will feature hands-on models where attendees practice laser treatment around teeth and implants. Also, attendees will practice using grafting materials to stabilize implants and teeth with soft and hard tissue disease.
